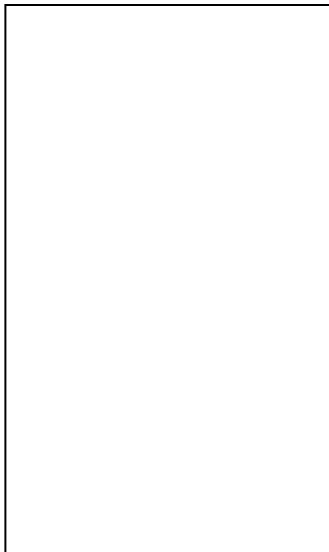

The Craft's Noyse:

Composers who were Freemasons:

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

Lived 1756-1791. Son of Leopold. A musical prodigy, he toured the courts of Europe as a very small boy, playing and composing. Undoubtedly one of the greatest composers who has ever lived, all of his music is still in print and almost all is available on recording. Several major annual music festivals around the world feature his music. Mozart was initiated into Zur Wohltatigkeit (Beneficence) Lodge on December 14, 1784. He wrote a considerable body of work for use in Lodge, both as part of the ritual and as entertainment. We also know that he frequently improvised music on the piano during the Lodge work. His Masonic Funeral Music is considered a ground breaking work (no pun intended). Undoubtedly the most important Masonic work however – and some critics say his greatest work, Masonic or not – was the opera *The Magic Flute*. The opera is considered Mozart's tribute to the Fraternity. The music is full of Masonic allusions, both in the action of the drama and in the structure of the music itself. The Master's Corner

"Six Principals of "Masonry"

- 1.) *To strive for a better understanding of the principals of Masonry as applied to the lodge room & everyday life.*
- 2.) *To promote harmony and concord among the members, to seek wise council, to aid the needy, to comfort & visit the sick and infirm.*
- 3.) *To remember that we, as Masons need the friendly atmospheres of the lodge; it promotes friendship, understanding & good will. Go to Lodge at least once a month.*
- 4.) *To remember that a single rose for the living is better than a costly wreath at the grave.*
- 5.) *To labor for the benefit of mankind, to remember our vows, to uphold the traditions of Masonry, to speak truthfully, to live gracefully, to act courteously.*
- 6.) *To remember, that above all else, charity is the chief virtue, for he whose heart is ruled by charity will be honored and remembered when earthly monuments have crumbled to dust.*

"Who's Who in the Masonic Zoo"

This Master Mason was a very remarkable man who started learning very early in life and never stopped. You should have figured out which famous Mason this was by the time you reach # 10.

At 5, he began studying under his cousin's tutor.

At 9, he studied Latin, Greek and French.

At 14, he studied classical literature and additional languages.

At 16, he entered the College of William and Mary.

At 19, studied Law for 5 years starting under George Wythe.

At 23, he started his own law practice.

At 31, he wrote the widely circulated "Summary View of the Rights of British America" and retired from his law practice.

At 32, he was a Delegate to the Second Continental Congress.

At 33, he wrote the Declaration of Independence.

At 36, he was elected the second Governor of Virginia succeeding Patrick Henry.

At 40, he served in Congress for two years.

At 46, he served as the first Secretary of State under George Washington.

At 57, he was elected the third president of the United States.

At 60, he obtained the Louisiana Purchase doubling the nation's size.

At 61, he was elected to a second term as President.

At 65, he finally retired to Monticello.

At 80, he helped President Monroe shape the Monroe Doctrine.

At 83, he passed to the celestial lodge above on the 50th anniversary of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence.
