Greetings to the brethren of York Lodge,
Brothers, as we approach warmer months and become less sedentary in our daily lives we should also consider becoming more active in our Masonic endeavors. With this in mind I would like to propose that we hold several events in the next couple of months before we go into darkness, starting with a fellowship night sometime in March. I suggest we have two: one that Madonna Chapter caters for us and one that we cater for them or hold both together. I believe this would be a great way to bond with our lodge sisters.

Next I would like the brethren to consider having a one day blood or food drive event combined with a parking lot/yard sale. We should also host another fundraising dinner for Kennebunk High School's Project Graduation sometime in May as well as to continue to have a CHIPS event during the May Day Festival which is traditionally held, weather permitting, on the first Saturday in May in Kennebunk. Lastly, we should help out as best we can during the annual Bentley Motorcycle Run which benefits our Scholarship Fund.

I would also like to mention that we are actively designing and estimating the cost of a Blazing Star and Tessellated Border in the center of the lodge to be constructed before our Bicentennial Celebration in March 2013. One unique way of funding this project is to build into the Blazing Star a cavity which can hold a time capsule to be sealed underneath the center of the Blazing Star right under the Altar to be opened in 50 years during our 250th year celebration in the year 2063. The contents of this time capsule can include current records and pictures of the lodge and its officers and brethren as well as submissions from the brethren. These submissions can pay for the project. Several different tiers can be established so that any and all brethren can participate in as small or as big a way as they would like depending on their monetary contribution to the project. The smallest submission can be as small as a piece of paper the size of a Post Card all the way up to the size of a shoe box, depending on the final size of the time capsule itself.

We are indebted to the pages of "The Freemasons' Monthly Magazine," April 1851, for this quotation of Rev. Brother Oliver who "satirizes the inquisitiveness of the uninitiated, in respect to the peculiar features and observances of the Masonic Brotherhood:"

"What is Masonry? This is a great and important question which has puzzled the heads of all the uninitiated from the day of its first establishment to our own peculiar times. What is Masonry? I could give 50 definitions of it if I chose to be communicative; but I should consider myself 'Courteous overmuch' were I to furnish the cowan with too great a portion of information at once. He would be gorged into a plethoric habit of mind, which would set him cackling like a young pullet after she had laid her first egg, and hops around the farmyard in an ecstasy of joy to tell her companions what a feat she has done. I shall give him only one definition at present, a triangle, placed in the centre towards the rising of the sun; chequered with the opus Grecanicum, circumscribed with the scroll work, permeating through the sephiroth, and graduating to a perfect heptad! There! Let the cowan digest that, and I will then impart some further instruction to edify his mind."
