They were returned the following day, Morgan was from Daviess Lodge #22, Lexington, KY....

Between 1737 and 1779 two sailing ships of interest operated off the U.S. eastern seaboard, Freemason and Master Mason. The Freemason caught fire and sank in Marblehead Harbor, Mass in 1779.

The Toast

The three generals grouped in the ancient Masonic toast "To the three Masonic Generals" were Warren, Wooster, and Montgomery. General Joseph Warren was born in 1741 at Roxbury, Mass. When war broke out he was commissioned a major general. He was killed at the battle of Bunker Hill, June 17, 1775. Warren was made a Mason in St. Andrews Lodge, Boston, Sept. 10 1761, passed November 2nd and raised November 26th. He was elected Master November 30, 1768 and became Grand Master in 1769. David Wooster was born at Strafford, Conn., in 1710. The General Assembly of Connecticut appointed him major general in the Revolutionary war. He was killed in action May 2, 1777. It was not known when or where Wooster was made a Mason but he was the first Worshipful Master of Hiram Lodge No. 1, of New Haven. Richard Montgomery was born in Dublin, Ireland, in 1737. He entered the British Army, rose to the rank of Captain, but resigned in 1772. Coming to New York, he married the daughter of Robert R. Livingston, who later became Grand Master of Masons of New York. At the outbreak of the war Congress commissioned him a brigadier general. He was killed in action at Quebec in 1775. When and where he was made a Mason is unknown. But all Masonic records accept him as a Mason.

We, the officers of York Temple Corporation, with the permission of the Worshipful Master of York Lodge, will post a quarterly newsletter to update the members of York Lodge and other interested parties, of the activities of the Temple Corp Committee. We will use this newsletter to express the needs of the building, by whom and how the needs of the building will be addressed, and an appeal for your ideas and support. This first Temple Corp Newsletter is being delivered to you as part of the Worshipful Master's Trestle Board to show his support and to be sure you will receive it. We, as a committee, want you to know what we are doing with the funds we are entrusted with by you. We also want you to be aware of the changes taking place in and around our building to make it more efficient, more attractive and to see that it last us another 40 years.

We have created a list of things that need to be done in no particular order. For want of a name for the list we are calling it the "Bucket List". We have attached a copy of the current list to this edition of the Newsletter and will also post a copy next to the white board on the right hand wall going into the dining room. If you identify things that you think should be done that are not on the list, there are instruction of how to contact us on the list. Call us or please attend a Temple Corp meeting in the dining room directly after the monthly Stated Meeting. Speak to one of the officers prior to the meeting so that we can get you on the meeting's agenda.

The operating expenses for the building (heat, electricity, water, etc.) are, at present, being covered by the rent collected. To pay this year's portion of the Roof Loan, Temple Corp is putting together a number of fund raising projects that will take place during the year 2010. We will post the schedule as soon as we have it complete. Currently we have the very generous \$750 donation from the 2009 Lodge Secretary and Treasurer set aside. Some of the things we have in the planning stage are the 2010 Wood Raffle, two off site pancake breakfasts, a public turkey dinner, and a whole pig roast. We have been asked if we would be willing to have Madonna Chapter OES partner with us to raise funds for the Roof Loan and other improvements to the building. We have gladly accepted their offer of help.

To support the "Bucket List" we want to ask the members of the Lodge to contribute to a fund that will pay for the materials needed. We will purchase a cookie jar and locate it in a highly visible place in the building so that members can contribute to it when they are in the building. We would like to ask each member to drop \$5 in the "Cookie Jar Fund" each month when they are in the building or send a \$60 check to Temple Corp for the year. If you chose this option, please make the check out to Temple Corp and write "Cookie Jar Fund" on the memo line. The Newsletter and the posted "Bucket List" will show you where the "Cookie Jar Fund" was spent as well as seeing the improvements in the building.

This aggressive undertaking is not going to be done by just a few of us. All of the members can help in many ways. Please think about what you can do when you look at the list. We are always open for suggestions.

York Temple Corp - Bucket List

This is a list of things that we have identified to improve the appearance and maintain our Lodge facilities. This is a living list and will be updated as items come off and others are identified for inclusion. It is our plan to post this list in our Temple Corp Newsletter and on the wall next to the Temple Corp White Board on a regular basis. As of today, March XX, 2010 the list is:

- 1. Seal the lower level windows*
- 2. Seal and caulk the cracks in the foundation*
- 3. Replace the broken or cracked exterior trim boards*
- 4. Paint exterior trim*
- 5. Reposition rear porch steps*
- 6. Repaint the signs and the letters on the front of the building*
- 7. Paint the lower portion of interior hall walls*
- 8. Replace curtains*
- 9. Rework window cornice boards*
- 10. Paint front porch*
- 11. Paint trim on Fire Exit interior and exterior*
- 12. Install a flag pole*
- 13. Run electricity to the far side of the parking lot*
- 14. Install a better garbage holding system*
- 15. Address the lighting of the exterior*

- 16. Replace burnt out light bulbs in the Lodge Hall*
- 17. Sweep the parking lot*

The projects on the list will not necessarily be done in the order that they appear on the list. When we have the money and talent available to start and complete a project we will tackle it.

So you ask, "How can I help?" Help can take many forms and not just "sweat equity". What do you see that needs to be done that we have missed? We need more sets of eyes looking at our building. We will expect you tell us what needs to be done, suggest how it can be done, and what you think it will cost. Help can also be materials, dollars, or work.
