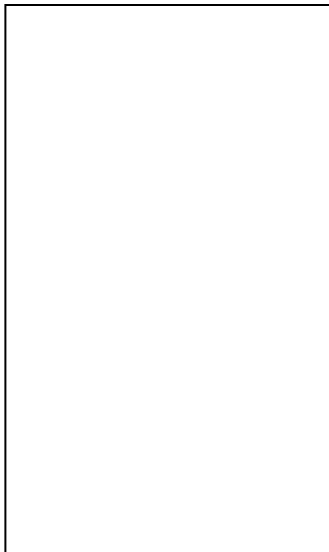

 Lived 1879-1951 American composer whose best-known work is probably the song: "Sweet Adeline," composed in 1903. Bro. Armstrong belonged to John Steward Lodge No. 871, New York.

"Pee Wee" King (Julius Frank Anthony Kuczynski)
 Lived 1914-2000 Composer of Country Music. Among his compositions are "Tennessee Waltz," and "Bonaparte's Retreat." He was a member of the "Grand Ole Opry" and was inducted into the Country Music's Hall of Fame in 1974.

William Pettee
 Lived 1839-1891. Wrote fraternal marches for Knights Templar Commandery and Rebecca Comandery.

200th Anniversary Projects

Our Anniversary year has begun with the installation of the Officers for 2013 and so have several of our projects.

The Anniversary hats have been created and will be available throughout the year.

A 200th Anniversary Apron (pictured below) was donated and presented to the incoming Worshipful Master who wore it during the installation ceremony. It is a one of a kind handmade item which will be used by the WM during the anniversary year and then placed on display in the Lodge. The apron was designed and created by Bro Patrick Craddock, a Masonic artist from Franklin, Tn. He has done extensive work in creating unique Masonic aprons and historic reproductions. Our apron is based the 1824 Moses Savory apron currently on display in our lodge.
